Central Florida Regional Hospital, a 221-bed acute care hospital and Level II Trauma Center, serves residents of Seminole County, west Volusia County and beyond. The level II trauma center provides life-saving care to critically injured patients from a five-county area, including victims of motor vehicle accidents, falls and penetrating wounds.

The only full-service cardiovascular program in Seminole and west Volusia counties, Central Florida Regional Hospital offers open heart surgery, interventional cardiology, electrophysiology, cardiac rehabilitation and comprehensive diagnostic services. Central Florida Regional Hospital is an Accredited Chest Pain Center with PCI from the Society of Cardiovascular Patient Care and Joint Commission Certified Advanced Primary Stroke Center.

Central Florida Regional Hospital's surgical services include general surgery, orthopedics, neurosurgery, cardiac and thoracic surgery, plastic surgery, ENT, obstetrics and gynecology, podiatry, urology and vascular surgery. Their quality care has earned Total Knee Replacement Certification and Sepsis Program Certification from The Joint Commission.

Advanced technology and physician expertise at Central Florida Regional Hospital provide minimally invasive treatment alternatives for many

patients, including robotic surgery for gynecology, general surgery, thoracic surgery and urology. The hospital also offers advanced technology for early detection and treatment of lung cancer, leading to better outcomes through minimally invasive treatment. In addition, Central Florida Regional Hospital vascular services provide the most current treatment options for a wide range of vascular and endovascular diagnoses, including carotid artery disease, peripheral arterial disease and abdominal aortic aneurysms.

The Rehabilitation Center at Central Florida Regional Hospital provides acute inpatient medical rehabilitation for patients with complex conditions such as stroke, spinal cord injury, amputations or brain injury. The Rehabilitation Center helps patients minimize physical or cognitive disabilities and gain greater independence after illness, injury or surgery. It has 13 large private rooms, a physical therapy gym, independent living suites and 24-hour immediate access to all hospital services. The Rehabilitation Center earned the highest level of accreditation awarded by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities.

South Seminole Hospital is part of Orlando Health, a \$3.8 billion not-for-profit healthcare system with nine hospitals, an extensive physician practice network and multiple care centers throughout Central Florida. The 206-bed acute care hospital was founded in 1984 and is located on State Road 434 in Longwood. South Seminole Hospital serves more than 45,000 patients each year through both its inpatient and outpatient facilities, and the 36-bed emergency department sees more than 30,000 patients annually.

South Seminole Hospital is also home to Orlando Health Behavioral Health, an 80-bed inpatient facility for patients needing comprehensive care for mental health issues. The hospital also serves as one of Orlando Health's three air care team helicopter bases, allowing for direct transport of critically ill or injured patients to the region's only level one trauma center at Orlando Health's Orlando Regional Medical Center, where patients can receive the highest level of emergency care available.

The first hospital in Seminole County with an accredited chest pain center, South Seminole Hospital also has an accredited heart failure program and a

recently added percutaneous coronary interventions (PCI) program, which is a nonsurgical procedure used to open blocked or narrowed coronary arteries, restoring blood flow to the heart without requiring open heart surgery. Providing the latest in cardiovascular care, radiologists and cardiologists perform both noninvasive and invasive procedures utilizing the latest advanced technologies and are experts in diagnosing and treating all types of heart disease. As a designated primary stroke center, the hospital has a specialized stroke team ready and equipped to

deliver rapid diagnosis and appropriate treatment to those experiencing stroke symptoms.

South Seminole Hospital offers a broad scope of surgical services, incorporating leading-edge techniques and technologies. As often as possible, surgeons perform minimally invasive procedures that eliminate the need for a large incision, but rather use tiny incisions that may result in less blood loss and a shorter recovery time. Robotic surgery is the newest advancement in minimally invasive surgery, and many surgeons at South Seminole Hospital routinely use the da Vinci® Robotic Surgical System as an alternative to traditional surgery. This advanced system can perform numerous specialized procedures with even greater precision than the human hand.

Other services at South Seminole Hospital include the following:

- Cancer services (located in Lake Mary)

- Laboratory and pathology
- Orthopedics and sports medicine
